High school application workshop: At a recent Saturday Session, RFE held a parent workshop with students who were interested in applying to private or independent high schools. The purpose was to share what to consider when selecting the schools they apply to, and creating a Ravenna account (the portal where most school applications are housed). We are grateful to the amazing Reach alumni who helped parents navigate the process of creating an account in English and Spanish.





As part of RFE's continued partnership with The Economist Educational Foundation and Rolex, Reach scholars are participating in a global competition called Leadership for Change. Through six one-hour lessons covering leadership in the fields of health care, girls' equality, and sustainable communities, students create and present a "Project for Change." Working in teams of two to three, students develop a plan to help improve their school or community. Winning projects will receive funding and mentorship to bring them to reality.

Students have already completed Lessons 1 and 2, and the energy is palpable among the scholars. They are excited to learn about leadership and apply these skills to better their school or community. These Reach middle school students will hone their presentation skills and pitch their projects to the Economist Educational Foundation Jury in December, competing against learners from all over the world!

As we celebrate the month of the Holy Rosary, the Marist vocation ministry in the District of Asia began their vocation campaigns at different schools in the Philippines.




